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1.0 Notice inviting Tender

- 1.1 Sealed tenders in the prescribed format are invited for Empanelment of agencies for providing technical manpower support for Supreme Court, High Court and District Courts nation wide for two years from the date of empanelment, which can be extended by further two years through mutual consent. However, NIC has the right to review the empanelment at regular intervals on the basis of satisfactory performance in the preceding period. NIC may also call for revised financial bid, from the technically qualified bidders at the time of extending the validity of the tender or, any time if deemed necessary.

2.0 Background and Scope

2.1 One of the critical recommendations of the E-Committee, Supreme Court of India in the National Policy, Action Plan and terms of cabinet approval is to provide technical manpower support for a fixed period of two years, to assist in various tasks involved in the project such as smooth operation and maintenance of the ICT system in the courts, assist judges and court staff in systems and hand holding operations and other similar support assistances.

2.2 Spread across country within India, there are around 13246 District & Subordinate courts in 499 judicial districts under the jurisdiction of 21 High Courts and Supreme Court. The tentative approximate requirement of technical manpower is enclosed in Annexure-F.

2.3 PROFILE FOR RECRUITMENT OF TECHNICAL MANPOWER:

2.3.1 The project aims at providing technical assistance to the courts and its stakeholders for use and smooth operation of the ICT system provided under the e-Court project. The profile of technical manpower required for technical support in terms of qualification and experience is enclosed at Annexure-F.

2.3.2 Based on the data received from the Supreme Court/ High Courts/District Courts, the E-Committee has estimated that the total technical manpower required at Supreme Court, High Court levels and at District Court level would be approximately of 4, 84 and 1422 respectively.

2.4 ROLES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND EMOLUMENTS OF TECHNICAL MANPOWER

The roles and responsibilities of desired technical manpower at different levels are given below:

E1:Senior System Officer (Supreme court & High Courts)

Pay : Rs 18,000/- (Rs Eighteen Thousand) per month consolidated payable to the technical persons inclusive of Income Tax Deductions.

Job Description:

- To assist the High Court in ICT system administration and management
- To manage ICT infrastructure such as computers, scanners, printers, LAN, Internet connectivity, communication equipment such as Switches, Routers, Modems, Wifi, etc.
- Interaction with vendors for maintaining and supporting the equipment
- Installation and maintenance of OS, office tools, customized application running, taking out of hard copies or soft copies of reports, etc.

- Assistance in training judges and court staff for effective utilisation of I.T resources.
- Ownership of problem resolution for addressing the complaints of District & Subordinate Courts for smooth operation of ICT infrastructure
- Such other technical support duties as assigned by the High Court from time to time.

Qualification & Experience :

- a) M.E/M.Tech in Computer Science with first class or minimum 60% marks in aggregate.

OR

- b) B.E / B.Tech / MCA in Computer Science/Engineering/Information Technology with first class or minimum 60% marks in aggregate with **One year** experience in relevant field.

Age Limit : Not exceeding 30 years

E2. System Officer (Supreme Court & High Courts)

Pay : Rs 11,100/- (Rs Eleven Thousand One Hundred only) per month consolidated payable to the technical persons inclusive of Income Tax Deductions.

Job Description:

- Assist the Central Project Coordinator & Senior System Officer in performance of their duties and/or discharge the same independently as and when required.
- Such other technical support duties assigned by the High Court from time to time.
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Qualification & Experience :

- a) B.E /B.Tech/ MCA in Computer Science/Engineering or Information Technology with first class or minimum 60% marks in aggregate.

OR

- b) Master Degree in Physics/ Maths/ Statistics/ Operations Research with first class or at least 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade with Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science/Applications Or Master Degree in Computer Science/Information Technology with first class or at least 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade.

OR

- c) B.SC (Computer Science or IT)/BCA/ B.sc/ in Physics /Maths/Statistics /Operations Research/ computer Science with either Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science / computer applications (from a Government recognized university/Institution) with Two Year working Experience. The bachelor's degree and Post Graduate Diploma should be with first class or at least 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade.

Age Limit : Not exceeding 30 years

E3. System Assistants (Supreme Court & High Courts)

Pay : Rs 6800/- (Rs Six Thousand Eight Hundred) per month consolidated payable to the technical persons inclusive of Income Tax Deductions.

Job Description:

- Maintenance/Upkeep of ICT infrastructure such as hardware, LAN, UPS, DG set, air-conditioning, etc in coordination with the concerned service providers

Such other duties assigned by the High Court

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Qualification & Experience:

Government-recognized ITI Diploma in Electronics/Computers or equivalent

Age Limit : Not exceeding 30 years

E4. System Officer (Districts)

Pay : Rs 11,100/- (Rs Eleven Thousand One Hundred only) per month consolidated payable to the technical persons inclusive of Income Tax Deductions.

Job Description:

- Assist the District and Taluka level Project Supervision Committees in system administration and management
- To manage ICT infrastructure such as computers, scanners, printers, LAN, Internet connectivity, communication equipment such as switches, routers, modems, wifi, etc.

- Interaction with vendors for maintaining and supporting the equipment
 - Installation and maintenance of OS, office tools, customized application, etc.
 - Assistance in training judges and court staff
 - Such other technical support duties assigned by the High Court from time to time
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Qualification & Experience :

- a) B.E /B.Tech/ MCA in Computer Science/Engineering or Information Technology with first class or minimum 60% marks in aggregate.

OR

- b) Master Degree in Physics/ Maths/ Statistics/ Operations Research with first class or at least 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade with Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science/Applications Or Master Degree in Computer Science/Information Technology with first class or at least 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade.

OR

- c) B.SC (Computer Science or IT)/BCA/ B.sc/ in Physics /Maths/Statistics /Operations Research/ computer Science with either Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science / computer applications (from a Government recognized university/Institution) with Two Year working Experience. The bachelor's degree and Post Graduate Diploma should be with first class or at least 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent grade.

Age Limit : Not exceeding 30 years

E5. System Assistants (Districts)

Pay : Rs 6800/- (Rs Six Thousand Eight Hundred) per month consolidated payable to the technical persons inclusive of Income Tax Deductions.

Job Description:

- Maintenance of ICT hardware, LAN, UPS, DG set, air-conditioning, etc in coordination with the concerned service providers
- Such other technical support duties assigned by the High Court from time to time

Qualification & Experience:

- Government-recognized Diploma in ITI or equivalent after 10th Standard

Age Limit : Not exceeding 30 years

2.5 DUTY AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PLACEMENT AGENCY

- (a.) The selected agency shall have complete responsibility of antecedents and character verification of the provided manpower. Such agency exclusive responsibility of good behaviour and lawful conduct of provided manpower.
- (b.) The Agency shall insure all personnel being provided to Courts administration. Courts administration/NIC shall not be held liable for any loss of life / injuries occurring out of personnel's negligence / natural causes.
- (c.) Technical manpower deployed for providing service will be employees of the agency and they will have no claim for absorption by the respective courts/NIC.
- (d.) The agency shall remove any person, if the court administration finds him unsuitable and shall replace him with suitable substitute within 10 days of written intimation in that regard by the court administration.
- (e.) Placement agency shall ensure that only the experienced and qualified personnel are deployed for all categories of technical personnel having the valid degree/diploma certificates issued by the recognized University/Institution and same shall be produced in original at Supreme Court, High courts and District Courts for each personnel offered by the agency for verification.
- (f.) The NIC, on the recommendation of the Supreme Court, and the respective High Courts, will have the right to terminate the contract of technical manpower supply at any time before expiry of stipulated period by issue of one month's notice to the agency in respect of the State(s) Court concerned. For such foreclosure, no compensation for reduction in scope shall be payable to the agency. Similarly, if the agency wants to withdraw the deployed technical manpower before expiry of contract period it will have to give one month's notice, failure to do so will result in forfeiture of the deposited security amount.
- (g.) The selected placement agency will forward Resumes of eligible candidates to NIC. Based on the qualifications and experience, NIC will short list the candidates and refer it to the E-Committee for approval. The placement agency will ask the short listed candidates to appear before an interview committee in the concerned High Court. The Interview Committee subject to any variance suggested by High Court, may consists of Registrar level nominee of respective High Courts, nominee of respective State government (Department of IT) or equivalent Department, a nominee of NIC (level to be decided by DG, NIC). A panel of selected candidates will be prepared. Agency will place the candidates as per the panel. A pool of candidates should be kept for leave reserve. In case of short leaves, candidates for leave reserve will be asked to report. In case any technical person quits the job or goes on long leave, proper substitute will be immediately placed.

- (h.) **Tool kits:** The Agency will provide Toolkits to all the 'System Assistants' to enable them to attend to the trouble shooting activities such as fixing of I/O outlets, soldering work, etc. The tool kit should include:

Digital Multimeter /tester, Screw driver set (Detachable Handle), Torex Set, Allen Key Set, Nose Plier, Tweezer, Soft Brush, antistatic Wrist Bands, Wire Cutter, Knife, Soldering Iron with Flux and solder wire, Iso Propyl Alcohol (Small Bottle), Carry Bag, head Cleaning CD. The Tool kit items should be ISI marked.

The Agency will provide training to all the System Assistants on various activities before they are deployed at the High Courts and District Courts. For this NIC will provide necessary guidelines.

- (i.) **Reporting of Technical Manpower:**
The technical manpower deployed by the agency at the High Courts under the project will report to the Central Project Coordinator (CPC) at the High Court and to the District Judge at the District Court. They will follow the directions of their reporting officers in implementing the project activities. Any operational and support related issues will be resolved by the respective reporting officer.

The technical manpower at the District Courts will have to attend to the problems at the Taluka/ Sub-district Courts under the direction of District Judge.

- (j.) **Training:**
If required the agency should deploy the technical persons for training on all the activities they are going to perform at their respective place of deployment. The training will be conducted at the City/Town where the High Court is located or at NIC State Unit, whichever the High Court decides. The technical persons are required to attend training programs as and when required.

2.6 TIME DURATION:

- i) The time duration of providing the technical manpower would be 2 (two) years.
- ii) The recruited personnel would be allocated to Supreme court & High courts and should report to the Secretary General, Registrar General /Registrars within 30 days of the date of placing of the order. At District courts they should report to the District Judges within 45 days from the date of placing of the order.
- iii) Joining date will start from the date of reporting.
- iv) The operationalisation of the work order will commence from the

date of joining/posting of the first person against the ordered manpower in the work order. Purchase Order/Work Order will terminate after the completion of time period mentioned in the work order from date of joining of first person. The services of the person joining subsequently will co-terminate with the Purchase Order/Work Order. If required fresh Purchase Order/Work Order will be placed to complete the remaining job.

2.7 INDEMINITY FOR COURTS & NIC :

For the engagement of technical support manpower through the tender identified agencies, all the Courts and NIC, shall have total indemnity for any eventual suffering or loss of lifetime of the engage personnel due to any reasons, met/faced/subjected to at any of the place of duty of deployment.

3.0 Eligibility Criteria for the Agency

- a. The agency must have two years of experience in handling and supporting IT projects with a total turnover as per ANNEXURE - H. The agency must enclose documentary evidence .
- b. Bidder or its direct franchise must have its own office in each of the State Capital or place where the High Court exists, for which it is quoted. For a list of State Capitals/High Courts where vendor's / its franchise office is to be located, refer to Annexure – E.
- c. Bidder should produce and enclose the following documentary support substantiations:-
 - i. Latest certificate of solvency from nationalised/ scheduled bank for an amount of Rs 10 Lacs or above
 - ii. Detail of the organisation, its area of function, financial status, and available manpower (at least the key personnel) etc.
 - iii. Attested copies of Articles of Association (in case of registered firms), bye laws and certificate of registration (in case of registered co-operative societies), Partnership deed (in case of partnership firm) must be enclosed.
- d. The agency must have a PAN Number and Service Tax registration.
- e. The agency should not have been blacklisted by any institution of Central/State government. The agency must furnish an affidavit on stamp paper in this regard.
- f. Subject to an unavoidable reason, the bidder has to attach documents providing proof of the above clause failing which bid is liable to be rejected.
- g. Enclose a copy of latest Income-Tax return filed.

4.0 Pre-bid Meeting

The Pre-bid meeting will be held at 10:30 hrs on 03-12-2007. NIC may modify the tender terms and conditions on the basis of Pre-bid meeting discussion. If need arises, outcome of the Pre-bid meeting will be published in the form of corrigendum on the website tenders.gov.in. No separate communication will be sent to the vendors who have participated in the pre-bid or who have sent queries before the pre-bid.

5.0 Earnest Money Deposit (EMD)

- 5.1 Earnest money deposit of Rs. 5 lakh per each Group of States/ Union Territories in the form of Demand Draft/Pay Order from a scheduled Commercial bank in favour of “NIC” payable at New Delhi.
- 5.2 If claiming exemption from submission of Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) the agency should be registered with the National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) for the tendered item. The registration certificate should be enclosed.

6.0 Bid Submission

- 6.1 Bid documents must be submitted at the address given below, before **12:30 hrs** of **10-01-2008** ("Submission Deadline"). The Technical Bids will be opened on the same day at **14:30** hrs at the address given below in the presence of the Bidders' representatives who wish to attend. Date and time of opening of Commercial Bid will be intimated to the technically Qualified Bidders.

- 6.2 The validity period of the proposal should be for 90 days from the date of submission. In the event of expiry of validity period due to unforeseen circumstances, the period will be extended with mutual consent and without any variation of cost estimates.
- 6.3 If claiming exemption from submission of Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) the agency should be registered with the National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) for the tendered item.
- 6.4 The bid is to be submitted in three envelopes as follows:

EN-01 - Sealed and superscripted "EMD". NIC tender for Providing technical manpower for Supreme court, High Courts and District Courts due on : **10-01-2008 at : 12:30 Hrs**". This envelop must contain the following:

- (1) Draft for the EMD **as indicated in clause 5.1** from a scheduled commercial bank favouring NIC payable at N. Delhi or the valid NSIC certificate enabling exemption from submission of EMD.

EN-02 – Sealed and superscripted "Eligibility Criterion and Technical Details – Annexure – A,B,C" NIC tender for Providing technical manpower for Supreme Court, High Courts and District Courts due on: **10-01-2008** at: **12:30 Hrs**". This envelop contains documents required as per eligibility criterion and Technical bids.

In case this envelope doesn't contain the Eligibility Criterion and the Technical Details (Annexure-A,B,C) or contains Financial Details (Annexure-D,E) along with the Details, the bid will be rejected.

EN-03 – Sealed and superscripted “Financial Details – Annexure – D,E” NIC tender for Providing technical manpower for Supreme court, High Courts and District Courts due on: **10-01-2008 at: 12:30 Hrs**”.

Financial bid as per format given at Annexure D & E shall be submitted in this envelope.

EN-04 – All the three envelopes should be placed in this envelope. It should be sealed and superscripted – NIC tender No: due on: **10-01-2008 at: 12:30 Hrs.**

6.5 Last date for bid submission

6.5.1 The bids must reach the **Section Officer, Tender Process Section, National Informatics Centre, 4th Floor, A-Block, CGO Complex, Lodi Road, New Delhi – 110003**, complete in all respects latest **by 10-01-2008 at: 12:30 Hrs.** No tender will be accepted beyond the above mentioned date & time.

6.6 Bid Validity

All the bids must be valid for a period of 90 days from the date of tender opening for placing the initial order. However, the rates should be valid for initial/extended period of empanelment from the date of empanelment. No request will be considered for price revision during the empanelment (contract) period. If necessary, NIC shall seek extension in the bid validity period beyond 90 days. The bidders, not agreeing for such extensions will be allowed to withdraw their bids without forfeiture of their EMD.

7.0 Opening of Bids

- 7.1 The tender bids will be opened in the presence of representatives of bidders on **10-01-2008** at **12:30 Hrs** at NIC, New Delhi. Only one representative per bidder shall be permitted to attend.
- 7.2 The sealed cover EN-01 containing, EMD will be opened in the first instance in the presence of bidder's representatives. In case EMD is in order. EN-02 containing Eligibility Criterion and Technical Details (Annexure-A,B,C) shall be opened at the same time. The technical bids will then be passed on to the duly constituted Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC).
- 7.3 The envelope EN-03 containing financial details – Annexure – D & E of only technically qualified bidders, shall be opened in the presence of bidders representatives (only one per bidder) on a date and time duly notified by NIC. The rates quoted by various bidders shall be read out and the bids shall be passed on to a duly constituted Financial Evaluation Committee (FEC) for evaluation. EMD of unsuccessful bidders shall be returned at this stage without any interest.

8.0 Evaluation of bids

- a. When deemed necessary, NIC may seek clarifications on any aspect of their bid from the agency. However, that would not entitle the agency to change or cause any change in the substance of the tender submitted or price quoted. This would also not mean that their quote has been accepted.
- b. The duly constituted committee may at its own discretion decide to inspect the agency's work premises to evaluate and ascertain the details as furnished by the agency in the basic bid and agency's competence to perform the services to be offered.
- c. NIC may waive any minor informality or non-conformity or irregularity in a bid, provided such waiver does not prejudice or affect the relative ranking of any other agency.
- d. If NIC considers necessary, revised Financial/Commercial Bids can be called for from the technically short listed agencies, before opening the original Financial/Commercial Bids. In that case, the revised bids should not be higher than the original bids, otherwise bid will be rejected and EMD forfeited.
- e. NIC shall however not bind itself to accept the lowest and/or any bid and reserves the right to accept and/or reject any bid, wholly or in part.

9.0 Selection Criteria

- 9.1 The two-stage selection procedure shall be adopted for evaluation of the bids. In the first stage, the eligibility criteria and technical bids shall be evaluated by a duly constituted Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC). The first process for the TEC is to examine the eligibility of the bidders as per the tender specifications. Bids of the agencies, not satisfying the eligibility criteria shall be rejected. Subsequently, the TEC would examine the technical details and may ask for additional information from the bidders. On request from the TEC, the bidding agencies may have to produce additional information. The time limit, in which the bidders' have to submit additional information, shall be decided by the TEC and its decision shall be final in this regard. The TEC can reject a bid, if the agencies fail to adhere to the specified time limit. NIC may visit to agency premises to find out the eligibility, infrastructure, technical suitability and competence of the Agency to perform the Contract
- 9.2 After approval of the TEC report by the competent authority, the processing of the second stage shall commence with the opening of the Commercial Bids of only the technically qualified Bidders on a date intimated to the qualified Bidders. A Financial Evaluation Committee (FEC) would scrutinize the commercial bids. The bids, found lacking in strict compliance to the commercial bid format or not quoting rates of all the items of the commercial bid (Annexure E or quoting incredibly low value of item(s) with a view to subverting the tendering process, shall be rejected straightaway and EMD of such vendor will be forfeited.
- 9.3 LQ-1 Agency will be decided as indicated in the annexure E.**
- 9.4 For empanelment of vendors for each Group of State/UT, opportunity shall be successively given to LQ-2, LQ-3 bidders to match the LQ-1 rates of that Group of State/UT. This process shall continue until the required number of bidders is finalized for empanelment for each Group. The maximum number of bidders to be empanelled for a group will be two. In case none of the agencies agree to match the LQ-1 rates, LQ-1 shall be the only bidder on the panel.
- 9.4 **Vendor can quote either one group of States/UTs or more groups as per Annexure E**

10.0 Award of Contract (Empanelment)

- a. On written communication from NIC for having qualified for empanelment the agency shall sign the contract (letter of empanelment) within 10 days of such communication. Failing which the offer shall be treated as withdrawn and EMD forfeited.
- b. **The Vendors or its franchise office must be present as indicated in the column State Capital/High Court location of Annexure –E.** The period of empanelment will be initially for two year. Depending on the requirements, NIC may extend the period of empanelment for additional two years through mutual consent. ***However, NIC has the right to review the empanelment at regular intervals on the basis of satisfactory performance in the previous period. NIC may also call for revised financial bid, from the technically qualified bidders at the time of extending the validity of the tender or, any time if deemed necessary.*** The empanelled agency(ies) will have to renew/re-submit the security deposit for the extended period of empanelment.
- c. The agency(ies) selected for empanelment shall give security deposit equal to 10% of total order value in the form of Bank Guarantee from a scheduled commercial bank for the duration of the work order or extended period, if any, in favour of NIC, New Delhi. On receipt of bank guarantee towards security deposit the EMD of the empanelled agencies will be returned without any interest. NIC will have the right to invoke the security deposit without assigning any reasons if performance of the empanelled agency is not found up to the mark.
- d. If there are more than one vendor is empanelled for a Group of State/UTs, the order will be split among the vendors.
- e. Work order will be placed by NIC and payments will be made to agency.

11.0 Payment terms

- a. During the period of placement the technical manpower provided by the placement agency will function under the administrative control of respective courts i.e. the Supreme Court, High Court, District courts and they will work as per their directions including the place of postings, transfers and their duties.
- b. The empanelled agencies will make the payment to their deployed manpower on receipt of a satisfactory attendance/performance certificate from the court administration. The payment shall be made for the number of days worked in a month as reported by the court administration within 10 days of the receipt of such information for locations at State Capitals/High Courts and within 15 days for locations at North-East, Districts & Talukas. The performance certificate should be submitted to NIC along with the bills.
- c. The attendance /performance certificate duly signed with official stamp by authorised court officials will be submitted by vendor to the NIC for bill payment.
- d. Proof of Payment in the form of acquaintance roll, duly signed with date by the individuals concerned or proof of dispatch of draft to its manpower, giving bank name, draft number, date and amount for individual cases in the case of outstation staff should be submitted monthly to NIC along with the bills.
- e. For partial payments the amount will be calculated by dividing the monthly amount by 30 and then multiply it by number of days worked.
- f. Pre-receipted bills certified by court officials in triplicate will be raised MONTHLY to NIC by the vendor for the payment. Payment will be made within 30 days of submission of completed documents in Indian Rupees.
- g. Normal working hours shall be 8 hrs. per day for 6 days a week as normally followed. The manpower supplied shall be having same closed holidays (Gazetted) as admissible/applicable to staff of court in the respective State.
- h. Payments shall be subject to deductions of any amount for which the Agency is liable under the agreement against this contract. Further, all payments shall be made subjects to deduction of TDS (Tax deduction at Source) as per the income- Tax Act and any other taxes.
- i. Should there be a requirement for extension of services of technical manpower, an extension order will be issued on the same terms & conditions.
- j. NIC reserves the right to carry out post-payment audit and technical examination of the final bill including all supporting vouchers, abstracts, etc. NIC further reserves the right to enforce recovery of any over payment when detected notwithstanding the fact that the amount of the final bill may be included by one of the parties as an item of dispute before an arbitrator appointed under clause 15.0 of this contract and notwithstanding the fact that the amount of the final bill figures in the arbitration

award.

- k. If as a result of such audit and technical examination any over payment is discovered in respect of any work done by the Agency or alleged to have been done by him under contract, it shall be recovered by NIC from the Agency by any of all of the methods prescribed above, and if any under payment is discovered, the amount shall be duly paid to the Agency by NIC.
- l. In case the any Senior System Officers or System officers are required to travel for project related works to the project site/ or attending trainings etc conducted on recommendation of District Judge or the Registrar General of High Courts the TA/DA shall be reimbursed as under per person:-

Train Fare for 3rd AC or Chair Car or Sleeper class on production of Ticket/ evidence. Wherever train connectivity is not available, Public transport is to be utilized other than AC buses.

DA @Rs.150/- per day per person.

No local conveyance will be paid.

In case of System Assistants for project related works to the project site/ or attending trainings etc conducted on recommendation of District Judge or the Registrar General of High Courts the TA/DA shall be reimbursed as under per person:

Train Fare Sleeper class on production of Ticket/ evidence. Wherever train connectivity is not available, Public transport is to be utilized other than AC buses.

DA @Rs.100/- per day per person.

No local conveyance will be paid.

Such expenditure will be reimbursed to the agency on submission of original documents.

12.0 PENALTY CLAUSES

- 12.1 The agency should start providing technical manpower within 30 days of receiving the work order from NIC for locations at State Capitals/High Courts & that of at Districts & Talukas within 45 days failing which penalty at the rate of Rs 250/- will be charged for that site per day per person subject to the ceiling of agency charges for the same where the manpower has not been provided. If such incidents occur more than three times, NIC can cancel the order and get the technical support from alternate sources at the risk & cost of the vendor.
- 12.2 The agency will ensure that salaries are given to the deployed technical professionals in time. Any unjustifiable delay will attract a penalty @ Rs. 250/- (Rupees Two hundred and fifty only) per day per person for the delayed period subject to the ceiling of 10 days. If the agency attracts penalty for any unjustified delay for three months for the same person, its security deposit will be forfeited and its order will be cancelled.
- 12.3 In case of non performance of selected technical personnel, being absent for longer duration , misbehaviour, any other reason that is unacceptable, the court concerned reserves the rights to reject the candidature of that personnel. In such case the Agency shall be liable to provide replacement of that personnel. If such case reoccurs more than 3 times, penalty will be imposed as per clause 12.1 above for the delayed period from the absence of the third candidate to joining of the fourth candidate.
- 12.4 If the selected agency is not able to fulfil its obligations under the contract, which includes non completion of the work, NIC reserves the right to select another agency to accomplish the work. Any costs, excess expenditure, damages etc. resulting out of the same shall have to be born by the selected agency.
- 12.5 If the agency does any malpractice in payment to any engaged technical manpower, its security deposit will be forfeited and his order will be cancelled.

13.0 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS & MISCELLANEOUS

- 13.1 Bidders are advised to study the Bid Document carefully. Submission of the Bid shall be deemed to have been done after careful study and examination of all instructions, eligibility norms, terms and requirement specifications in the tender document with full understanding of its implications. Bids not complying with all the given clauses in this tender document are liable to be rejected. Failure to furnish all information required in the tender Document or submission of a bid not substantially responsive to the tender document in all respects will be at the bidder's risk and may result in the rejection of the bid.
- 13.2 Bids shall be received at NIC at the address, date and time as specified above. In the event of the specified date for the receipt of Bids being declared a holiday for NIC, the Bids will be received up-to the indicated time on the next working day. Any bid received by NIC after the last date for receipt of bids prescribed by NIC, pursuant to above Clause, will be declared late and will not be accepted and /or returned unopened to the bidder.
- 13.3 The offers submitted by fax/Email or any manner other than specified above shall not be considered. No correspondence will be entertained on this matter.
- 13.4 At any time prior to the last date for receipt of bids, NIC, may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective agency, modify the Tender Document by an amendment. The amendment will be notified on NIC's website, which will be binding on the prospective agencies to consider the amendment for quoting. In order to give prospective agencies reasonable time to take the amendment into account in preparing their bids, NIC may, at its discretion, extend the last date for the receipt of bids. No bid may be modified subsequent to the last date for receipt of bids. No bid may be withdrawn in the interval between the last date for receipt of bids and the expiry of the bid validity period specified by the agency in the bid. Withdrawal of a bid during this interval may result in forfeiture of Agency's EMD.
- 13.5 The agencies shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of their bids. NIC will, in no case, be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the outcome of the tendering process.
- 13.6 Alterations if any in the tender should be attested properly by the Agency, failing Which the tender is liable to be rejected.
- 13.7 Printed terms and conditions of the bidders will not be considered as forming part of their bid. In case terms and conditions of the contract applicable to the Invitation of bid are not acceptable to any bidder, they should clearly specify the deviations in their bids. Any effort by an agency to influence NIC's bid evaluation, bid comparison or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of the agency's bid and forfeiture of the agency's EMD.

- 13.8 NIC reserves the right to accept any bid, and to cancel/abort the Tender process and reject all bids at any time prior to award of Contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected agency or agencies, of any obligation to inform the affected agency of the grounds for NIC's action.
- 13.9 The Agency shall perform the services and carry out its obligations under the Contract with due diligence and efficiency, in accordance with generally accepted techniques and practices used in the industry and with standards recognized by national/international professional bodies. The Agency shall always act, in respect of any matter relating to this Contract, as faithful advisors to NIC and shall, at all times, support and safeguard NIC's legitimate interests in any dealings with Third parties.
- 13.10 NIC/court administration reserves the right to inspect the performance of the agency prior to commencement or in between the work progress. The inspection may cover all areas related to the assigned work order, especially methodology, manpower, infrastructure etc. NIC/court administration reserves the right to cancel the work order assigned to the agency at any time which includes the time after the completion of assigned work without assigning any reason for the same. In case the work order is cancelled then the costs incurred will be born by the agency and under no circumstances the agency shall be eligible for any payment or damages from the NIC/court administration.
- 13.11 The selected agency shall not, without NIC's prior written consent, disclose the Contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample of information furnished by or on behalf of NIC in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the Agency in the Performance of the Contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 13.12 It is to be noted that engagement with Supreme court/High court/District Court shall not confer any right on any individual for preference in employment in Supreme Court/High court/District Court or for his continuation in subsequent years.
- 13.13 The selected agency would submit bio-data with three photographs of selected candidates in the prescribed form to NIC in triplicate. The formats will be provided before the commencement of the hiring process.
- 13.14 The concerned court / NIC may at any time terminate the Contract by giving written notice to the selected Agency, without compensation to the selected Agency, if the selected Agency becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to court concerned.
- 13.15 The concerned court /NIC may by written notice sent to the selected Agency, terminate the work order and/or the Contract, in whole or in part at any time of its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for court's convenience, the extent to which performance of work under the work order and /or

the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective. The concerned court /NIC reserves the right to elect :

- 13.15.1 To have any portion completed at the work order and/or the Contract terms and prices; and/or
 - 13.15.2 To cancel the remainder and pay to the selected Agency an agreed amount for partially completed Services.
- 13.16 In the event the Agency's Company or the concerned division of the Company is taken over/bought over by another company, all the obligations under the agreement with NIC, should be passed on for compliance by the new company in the negotiation for their transfer.

INDEMNITY

- 13.22 The selected agency shall indemnify the NIC against all third party claims arising under this tender and from technical manpower deployed under the project.

DUTIES AND POWERS OF NIC REPRESENTATIVE

- 13.23 The duties of the representative of the NIC are to watch and supervise the works performed by various categories of personnel on board.
- 13.24 The NIC may, from time to time in writing, delegate to his representative any of

the powers and authorities, vested in the NIC and shall furnish to the agency a copy of all such written delegation of powers and authorities. Any written instruction or written approval given by the representative of the NIC to the agency within the terms of such delegation shall bind the agency and the NIC as though it has been given by the NIC.

- 13.25 If the Agency is dissatisfied with any decision of the representative of the NIC, it will be entitled to refer the matter to the NIC who shall there upon confirm, reverse or vary such decision and the decision of the NIC in this regard shall be final and binding on the agency.

14.0 Termination for Insolvency & default

14.1 Termination for Insolvency

NIC may at any time terminate the work order / contract by giving written notice of four weeks to the agency, without any compensation to the agency, if the agency becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent.

14.2 Termination for default

- a. Default is said to have occurred
 - If the agency fails to deliver any or all of the services within the time period(s) specified in the work order or any extension thereof granted by NIC.
 - If the agency fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract / work order.
- b. If the agency, in either of the above circumstances, does not take remedial steps within a period of 30 days after receipt of the default notice from NIC (or takes longer period in spite of what NIC may authorize in writing), NIC may terminate the contract / work order in whole or in part. In addition to above, NIC may at its discretion also take the following actions
 - NIC may transfer upon such terms and in such manner, as it deems appropriate work order for similar support service to other agency and the defaulting agency shall be liable to compensate NIC for any extra expenditure involved towards support service to complete the scope of work totally.

15.0 Force Majeure

- a. Force majeure clause shall mean and be limited to the following in the execution of the contract / purchase orders placed by NIC :-

16.0 Arbitration

If any dispute shall arise between parties on aspects not covered by this agreement, or the construction or operation thereof, or the rights, duties or liabilities under these except as to any matters the decision of which is specially provided for by the general or the special conditions, such dispute shall be referred to two arbitrators, one to be appointed by each party and the said arbitrators shall appoint an umpire in writing before entering on the reference and the award of the arbitration or umpire, as the case may be, shall be final and binding on both the parties. The arbitrators or the umpire as the case may be, with the consent of parties, may modify the time frame for making and publishing the award. Such arbitration shall be governed in all respects by the provision of the Indian Arbitration Act, 1996 or later and the rules there under and any statutory modification or reenactment, thereof. The arbitration proceedings shall be held in New Delhi, India.

17.0 Applicable law

The work order shall be governed by the laws and procedures established by Govt. of India, within the framework of applicable legislation and enactment made from time to time concerning such commercial dealings/processing.
